Project Name: **Willamette Water Supply Hall Street Pump Station**

Case File No.: **CU2021-0016 / DR2021-0102 / TP2021-0010**

Summary of Application: The applicant, Willamette Water Supply Program, requests a New Conditional Use Permit approval and Design Review Three approval to construct a new pressure and flow control facility for a regional water supply line. The applicant also requests a Tree Plan Two for the removal of 14 community trees.

Project Location: The site is located at the north corner of SW Hall Boulevard and SW Olesen Road, specifically identified as addresses 9120 - 9180 SW Hall Boulevard, Tax Lot 01200 on Washington County Tax Assessor's Map 1S126CA.

Zoning & NAC: Commercial – Washington Square (C-WS) / Denney Whitford / Raleigh West NAC

Applicable Approval Criteria: Development Code Section 40.03.1 *Facilities Review* and Section 40.15.15.5.C *New Conditional Use* Section 40.20.15.3.C *Design Review Three* Section 40.90.15.2.C *Tree Plan Two*

The Planning Commission shall conduct hearings in accordance with adopted rules of procedure and shall make a decision on the development application after the hearing closes. Failure to raise an issue in a hearing, by testifying in person or by letter, or failure to provide statements or evidence with sufficient specificity to afford the decision making authority an opportunity to respond to such issue, precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals on the issue.

Facilities Review Committee Meeting Day: November 10, 2021

The Facilities Review Committee is not a decision making body, but advises the Director and Planning Commission on a project's conformity to the technical criteria specified in Section 40.03.1 of the Beaverton Development Code. The Director will include the Committee's recommendation in the staff report to the decision making authority. The Facilities Review Committee meeting is open to the public, but is not intended for public testimony.
