Re: Hartwood Hylands Lot 118
Case TP2020-0006/SDM2020-0006

This is a follow-up to our phone conversation of last Friday.

My house at 6992 SW Tierra del Mar Drive in Beaverton is the adjoining property to the west of Lot 118.

I have no issue with the Development Proposal as stated, but I am concerned about an unintended consequence of the tree removal.

Lot 118 is an undeveloped lot which features a stand of large trees which extends over the property line to include several trees that appear to be on my side of the line. I am concerned that removal of the trees per the current plan will result in two trees close to my house becoming isolated trees without the wind protection formerly provided by the rest of the stand. This would increase the probability that they would fall in a windstorm that they would survive as part of the former stand of trees.

I have attached a photo identifying the trees: The house in the background is my house

Trees marked 1 and 2 are the trees I want to add to the cutting plan.
Trees marked 3 and 4 are on Lot 118 and are already tagged.

I request that the two trees (marked 1 and 2) be included in the current tree removal plan to remove the potential danger of them falling on and damaging my house in a storm wind
